


California-Inspired Spring Wine Dinner

# Oceanids—Sounding Board Thursday, April 4

## Dr. David A. Shirk

"Five Reasons to Care About US-Mexico Relations"

**Dr. David A. Shirk** is the director of the Trans-Border Institute and Assistant Professor in the Political Science Department at the University of San Diego. He received his B.A. in International Studies at Lock Haven University, and his M.A. and Ph.D. in Political Science at the University of California, San Diego, and was fellow at the Center for U.S.-Mexican Studies from 1998-99 and 2001-2003. He conducts research on Mexican politics, U.S.-Mexican relations, and law enforcement and security along the U.S.-Mexican border. He teaches and lectures widely on related issues in the United States, as well as Latin America and Europe. Dr. Shirk is currently the principal investigator for the Justice in Mexico project (<a href="www.justiceinmexico.org">www.justiceinmexico.org</a>), a bi-national research initiative on criminal justice and the rule of law in Mexico.

Sounding Board is a series of seven lectures during the academic year, the first Thursday at **12 noon**, sponsored by UC San Diego Oceanids and the UC San Diego Faculty Club. Oceanids, faculty and friends meet at the UCSD Faculty Club in a specially designated room to eat lunch and listen to fascinating speakers. Robert Koenigsberger

Founder, CIO, Managing Partner Gramercy

"Emerging Markets Perspective on the European Debt Crisis"

Robert S. Koenigsberger is founder, chief investment officer and the managing partner of Gramercy. He founded Gramercy in 1998 with a vision for the firm to become a global, institutional investment management firm focused on emerging markets. Koenigsberger has more than 25 years of investment experience dedicated to emerging markets with a specialization in fixed income securities. He serves as portfolio manager for Gramercy Argentina Opportunity Fund and co-portfolio manager for Gramercy

Emerging Markets Fund, Gramercy Distressed Opportunity Fund and Gramercy Distressed Opportunity Fund II. In 2010, he led Gramercy's efforts in conceiving, organizing and facilitating the successful restructuring of Argentina's defaulted debt, the first private sector-led restructuring of a sovereign default. Koenigsberger is head of theInvestment Committee and the Asset Allocation Committee. Prior to founding Gramercy, Koenigsberger was a senior vice president at Lehman Brothers from 1995 to 1998, where he managed the bank's sovereign debt restructuring group. Prior to that, he was a vice president at Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith Incorporated for three years where he traded performing and distressed emerging markets debt securities in New York, London and Hong Kong. From 1987 to 1991, he held the position of vice president at CR-P Associates, a financial advisory firm with offices in Central and South America that led sovereign debt restructurings, debt buy-backs and debt-equity swap transactions in Latin America. Koenigsberger received a Master of Business Administration in finance from the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania, a Master of Arts in international studies with a concentration in Latin America from the University of Pennsylvania and a Bachelor of Arts in Latin American political science and history of Latin America with a minor in economics from the UC San Diego, where he graduated with honors. He completed his undergraduate and graduate theses on the historical origins and implications of the Latin American debt crisis.

## Featuring Chancellor Pradeep K. Khosla

Wednesday, April 24, 2013 5:30pm, UC San Diego Faculty Club

Pradeep K. Khosla, a distinguished academic leader and electrical and computer engineer, is the eighth Chancellor of UC San Diego. He previously served as Dean of Engineering at Carnegie Mellon University. Khosla is an elected member of the National Academy of Engineering, a Fellow of the Indian Academy of Engineering, an Honorary Fellow of the Indian Academy of Science and a Fellow of the American Association of Artificial Intelligence. He is the recipient of numerous awards for his leadership, teaching and



research, including the 2012 Light of India Award, a Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, and the George Westinghouse Award for contributions to improve engineering teaching. In 2012, he was named one of the 50 most influential Indian-Americans by SiliconIndia. He received his bachelor's degree from the Indian Institute of Technology, and his master's and doctoral degrees in electrical and computer engineering at Carnegie Mellon.
