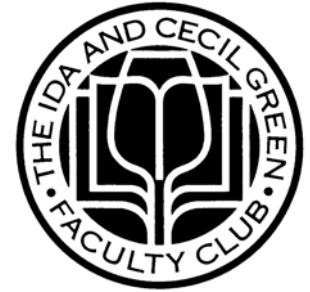

**China and the Future of U.S. Competitiveness**

Since 2001, the United States has lost over one third of its manufacturing jobs. Surging U.S. imports from China are an important causal factor behind this decline. Does the U.S. have a future as an industrial economy? Will China simply take over global manufacturing? Professor Hanson uses insights from his ongoing research on China's impact on the U.S. economy to find answers to these questions.

Gordon Hanson holds the Pacific Economic Cooperation Chair in International Economic Relations at UC San Diego, where he is director of the Center on Emerging and Pacific Economies and has faculty positions in the School of International Relations and Pacific Studies and the Department of Economics. He is also a Research Associate in the National Bureau of Economic Research, a co-editor of the Review of Economics and Statistics, and a member of numerous international scholarly organizations. Professor Hanson, who is an expert on international trade and international migration, is among the most widely cited economists of his generation and is frequently quoted in the media. Prior to joining UCSD in 2001, he was on the economics faculty at the University of Michigan (1998-2001) and at the University of Texas (1992-1998). He received his Ph.D. from MIT in 1992. In 2011, Professor Hanson received the Chancellor's Associates Award for Excellence in Research in Social Science and the Humanities from UC San Diego.

**Aunt Louie's Cheese Balls****Makes About 30 Cheese Balls**

- 1 1/4 cups of flour
- 1 1/4 cups of finely grated parmesan cheese
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard, more to taste
- 1/2 cup melted butter, more if needed

1. Mix the flour in a bowl with the parmesan cheese, salt, pepper and dry mustard. Stir in the melted butter so the mixture forms crumbs. Kneading with your hands, press it into balls the size of small walnuts—a half tablespoon measuring spoon can be a help here. If the mixture is very dry and crumbly, add a bit more melted butter. Set the balls on a buttered baking sheet and chill about 15 minutes. Heat the oven to 375°F/190°C.
2. Bake the cheese balls in the oven until browned, 35-45 minutes. Test by cutting into a ball, it should not be doughy in the center. Transfer the cheese balls to a rack to cool. They can be stored in an airtight container for up to a week, and I always have back-up supply in the freezer.
